You will be given a list of 5 words beginning with **re-** to learn over the next week. You can choose to do this any way you would like, for example by asking someone to test you or by writing sentences which include these words.

English

Next week in English we will be concluding our dinosaur research and using this to write our own information pages. Can you find out any more information about the dinosaur you are studying over the weekend, ready to share with your group on Monday?

Maths

Next week we will be looking at word problems using RUCSAC and our written methods for addition and subtraction.

We will be continuing to learn the 5 times table for the Times Table Challenge. Don't forget to learn the division facts for the times table too, e.g. $45 \div 5 = 9$ (or *how many 5s are in 45?*) and complete your 5 times table booklet.
