## Space Adventurers

This week on Tuesday we had our Science Enrichment Day. The children were all very enthusiastic and shared their outstanding knowledge of space, planets and rockets.

We had lots of fun activities to do including printing planet pictures using balloons.



We also made an astronaut with moving arms and legs. We had some frozen ice balls in the water tray to help us to think about very cold planets that are far away from the sun.



In the afternoon we used our outdoor classroom to imagine that we were exploring space. We built space helmets to help us to breathe and we even made rockets and flames from things we could find outside.
