Topic	 Create a game inspired by a Victorian game
	 Play a Victorian game; snakes and ladders, draughts, marbles
	Write a diary entry about your day at school
	 Visit some Victorian buildings in York and find out what they were used for
	 Take a picture as a Victorian/draw a portrait of yourself in the Victorian era
	Research a famous Victorian
	 Use an atlas to explore the countries that made up the British Empire
	 Research some famous Victorian Inventions
	 Write a newspaper report about the coronation of Queen Victoria
	Read a story by Charles Dickens
	 Follow a Victorian recipe and bring it into school (eg Victoria sponge)


Time will be given in class for the children to talk about what they have found out and share work they have completed.

For each topic we will have an 'ignition day' to inspire and immerse the children into the topic. Topics will end with a celebration to bring together and share the work we have completed.

Topic Ignition - Castle Museum Visit Topic Celebration - Victorian Classroom

As part of our topic this term we will be ...

- Exploring a class novel (The Railway Children Class 5, 6 and 7 and Street Child - Class 8 and 9)
- Sharing poems by Edward Leer/Lewis Carrol
- · Writing diary entries and balanced arguments
- Creating observational drawings and looking at the work of William Morris
- · Investigating how electricity works and its uses
- Researching technology from the past
- Finding out about British history particularly Victorian York
- Learning and performing Victorian dances



Things to do to help your child:

- Listen to them read as often as possible
- Share books regularly with your child
- Help them practise their letters and words
- Make sure they have their PE kit on the correct days
- Ask your child what they have been learning
- Give them opportunities to visit the library or websites to 'read around' the topic and gather information of interest to them.
