Google Meet 'live' sessions

Dear Parents/Carers of Key Stage 2 children,

Thank you for completing the form giving permission for your child to take part in our live Google Meet sessions. If you still need to give your consent, please complete this form: <https://forms.gle/4FqfLRDGU9WqphPg9> as soon as possible so that your child/ren can take part.

These sessions will begin after half term, they will take place twice daily from Tuesday 23rd February at 9am and 11.45am. These timings will enable your child's teacher to lead each session and will allow another adult to be present on the call.

Children will remain on mute unless directed to unmute by the teacher if they have indicated they have a question/wish to speak. No one will be required to speak if they do not wish to. The sessions will be an opportunity for the teachers to explain the key learning points for that day and talk through any activities. It also provides the opportunity for the children to see each other and their teacher on a regular basis. We are well aware how much the children are all missing that contact at this time.

The teachers will go through a class register at the beginning of each session. Although not compulsory, we would advise the children attend each session if possible. Regrettably if you have not given consent on the Google Form your child will not be permitted to join in with the Google Meet and would have to be removed from the session.
