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★ AUTHORISED OR UNAUTHORISED ABSENCES? ★

It is a legal requirement for schools to keep a register twice a day.

Schools have to decide on whether absences are authorised or unauthorised.

Authorised absences include:

- illness
- medical appointments (proof will be required otherwise school won't be able to authorise the absence)
- days of religious observance
- leave granted only in exceptional circumstances

Unauthorised absences include:

- holidays in term-time (not exceptional circumstances)
- celebrating a birthday
- looking after parents or siblings
- minding the house
- going shopping
- oversleeping
- arriving late

The above include collecting your child before hometime.

Only the headteacher is allowed to determine whether absences are authorised or unauthorised.

School attendance is important because the law requires it. As a parent you are legally responsible for making sure your child gets a full time education.

BELOW 90% ATTENDANCE

School monitor all children's attendance closely.

If your child's attendance falls below 90%, we will contact you either by letter or telephone to highlight our concerns.

If your child's attendance continues to decline, you will be invited into school for a meeting to discuss what school can do to support you and your family, to improve attendance.



REPORTING AN ABSENCE



If your child is unable to attend school, please contact the school office before 8:55am with full details of the reasons why. If we do not hear from you, we will ring you to find out why your child is not in school. If you do not provide a reason for your child's absence, this absence will be recorded as unauthorised.
