## Every Day Counts.

BE AN ATTENDANCE HERO - HERE, EVERYDAY, READY, ON TIME

Welcome to our Spring Term 2 Newsletter!
Our whole school attendance target is $\mathbf{9 7 \%}$.
This target is based on the government expectations for school attendance. However, our attendance for last academic year was below $\mathbf{9 5 \%}$ and our current whole school attendance is also $\mathbf{9 5 \%}$.
We need to improve this to reach our target.
At Park Grove we know the impact regular attendance has on your child's learning and well-being; and that having good attendance is directly linked to raising achievement and develops skills for life and work. Regular attendance enables pupils to adapt better to routines, schoolwork, and friendship groups.

Therefore we ask that parents / carers support the school by ensuring that your child attends school every day and arrives ready to learn and on time.

## BEING ON TIME EVERYDAY

## ALL DOORS OPEN AT 8:35AM

Frequent lateness can negatively affect your child's mental health, learning ability, concentration and friendships.

Children who frequently arrive late are at a significant disadvantage compared to those who arrive on time, every day.

School starts promptly at 8:45am.


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## ILLNESS

From time to time your child will wake up in the morning saying that they feel unwell.

Whilst we do encourage children to come to school even if they 'feel a little unwell,' we do not want any child who is genuinely ill with chickenpox or measles, for example, to come to school.
Please note, we have now reduced our sickness and diarrhoea policy to 24 -hour from the last episode, as advised by Public Health England.
Always try and send your child to school if they are a little 'under the weather' - for example with a runny nose, cough, headache, tummy ache. School will always contact you if your child becomes too unwell.

## WHAT IS PERSISTENT ABSENCE?

School monitors all children's attendance closely.

If your child's attendance falls below $97 \%$, we will contact you by letter to highlight our concerns.

If your child's attendance continues to decline to below $\mathbf{9 0 \%}$, they are classed as a persistent absentee (PA).
You will be invited into school for a meeting to discuss what school can do to support your family to improve attendance.

## REPORTING ABSENCES

If your child is going to be absent you must contact school every day no later than 9.30am to let us know the reason why - it is a legal requirement for parents/carers to inform school.

If no message is received, the following procedures will be followed:

A text message will be sent, followed up with a phone call home. If there is no contact by $\mathbf{1 2 . 0 0} \mathbf{p m}$, we will conduct a well being and safeguarding visit to the house to ensure everyone is safe. We have a duty of care to ensure your child's safety as well as their regular school attendance.

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## HOLIDAYS IN TERM-TIME

As a school, we are not allowed to authorise holidays during term-time unless they are 'exceptional circumstances.'
Parents will be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice if they proceed with the unauthorised holiday.
A Fixed Penalty Notice can require a parent to pay a sum of $£ 60$ for each child taken on holiday. Each parent can be issued with a notice for each child so two parents with two children can potentially be issued with four notices of $£ 60$ each ( $£ 240$ in total). The Government is planning on increasing this to $£ 80$ per child, per parent.
