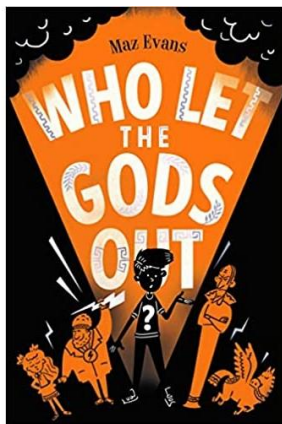

Geography

Grid reference
4 figure (Yr 4)
6 figure (Yr 6)

Used to locate a particular grid square on a map. Go to the eastings (horizontal number) first and then the northings.

Geographical features

Geographical features are the Earth's bumps and dips, like mountains, valleys, and oceans!

Atlas

An atlas is a collection of maps and information that shows geographical features of an area.

History

Olympics

Ancient Greeks held the first Olympic games in 776 BC.

Minoan

Bronze Age civilization of Crete from about 3000 bce to about 1100 bce

Mycenaean

Bronze Age civilisation from approximately 1750 to 1050 bce

Dark Age

Period of Greek history from the end of the Mycenaean civilization, around 1100 bce

Archaic

Period of Greek history lasting from c. 800 bce to the second Persian invasion of Greece in 480 bce

PE - Rounders & Frisbee

Fielding

Handling the ball while playing in the field.

Cardiovascular Endurance

Movements over an extended period of time to increase stamina

Music - Performances

Rhythmic Accuracy

Playing notes and rests exactly at the right time to create a steady pulse and groove.

Rhythmic Patterns

Creating a pattern with a series of musical notes and rests

Melodies

A sequence of single notes that creates a tune

Computing

Program (Yr 4)

A specific set of ordered operations for a computer to perform

Debugging (Yr 4)

Finding and correcting errors or bugs in a computer program

Sequencing (Y5)

A series of instructions that must be carried out in order.

Repetition/loops (Y5)

Doing the same thing more than once

Religious Festivals	A time of special importance marked by adherents to that religion
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Afterlife	An existence after death
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PSHE -

Healthy Habits (Yr 4)	Usual ways of behaving.
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Hazards (Yr 4)	Something that could cause damage or harm.
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Hygiene (Y5)	The way we care for our bodies.
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Responding to emergencies (Y5)	Understanding what to do in certain situations.
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Art

Expressionism	Art that tries to convey emotion and meaning rather than reality
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Portrait	Artwork about a person that shows us who they are

Festivals and celebrations	Studying a range of texts
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Climate and travel	creating a text using simple future tense - Je vais
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Science - Electricity (Yr 4)

Electrical circuit	A complete loop that provides electricity a path to move through.
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Conductor	Allows electricity to flow through
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Insulator	Does not allow electricity to flow through
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Science - Electricity and Light (Yr 5)

Circuit	closed loop that allows electricity to flow in a complete path
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Reflect	Light bounces off surfaces and changes direction
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Light waves	Moving energy made of tiny particles called photons.
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DT - Creating stable structures

Stable structure	A structure that can resist collapsing or bending under pressure
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Measure accurately	Use appropriate equipment to record measurements
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
