Through the Ages

History - Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age

Stone Age	A prehistoric period when weapons and tools were made of stone
Bronze Age	A prehistoric period that followed the Stone Age and preceded the Iron Age
Iron Age	A prehistoric period that followed the Bronze Age, when weapons and tools came to be made of iron.
Hill Forts	A fort built on a hill used in the Iron Age
Metalworking	The process of shaping and manipulating metals to create useful objects, parts, and structures

Palaeolithic	Early phase of the Stone Age, lasting about 2.5 million years
Mesolithic	Middle part of the Stone Age, between the Palaeolithic and Neolithic
Neolithic	Later part of the Stone Age, when ground or polished stone weapons and implements were used.
Bronze Age	A prehistoric period that followed the Stone Age and preceded the Iron Age
Iron Age	A prehistoric period that followed the Bronze Age, when weapons and tools came to be made of iron.
Hill Forts	A fort built on a hill used in the Iron Age
