



Year 6 National Child Measurement Programme

Dear Parent/Carer,

Every year in England, children in year six have their height and weight measured as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP).

Children who take part will be weighed and measured fully clothed, except for their shoes. Information is not shared with them on the day to ensure that they do not compare their results with others. The information is recorded on your child's existing electronic health record, and you will be sent a letter with your child's results for your information.
