A MESSAGE FROM MISS SAWYER

This week, our entire school community participated in Anti-Bullying Week, dedicating significant time and focus to fostering a supportive and kind environment. We held three whole-school assemblies where we talked with the children about what it truly means to stand up to bullying and how to actively support their friends.

A key learning outcome this week is the ability to confidently distinguish between conflict and bullying. We emphasised that conflicts are a normal, even healthy, part of growing up, provided that both parties have equal power and a desire to resolve the issue. We empower children to recognise when a disagreement crosses the line into bullying. We encourage you to ask your child about their learning this week. They may also be excited to share the steps of our 'Fix it Five' approach, a tool we teach them to independently and respectfully resolve minor conflicts with their friends.
